

1. The Pattern of Power


Exodus 17:8-13

Israel vs. Amalek

- Joshua was fighting
- Moses was interceding
 - Moses hands up: winning
 - Moses hands down: losing

Joshua won!

But who really won?



Joshua was "doing the ministry."

He was not praying much.

But the battle was won by intercession.

Many Christian leaders are like Joshua.

- In the work place
- In the church

They need prayer but they're not going to generate the high-level of prayer that is needed!

However, there are intercessors who can and will!

2. Why Leaders Need Intercession

Too many Christian leaders are falling!

- In the church
- In the workplace

One remedy: The power of intercession! Everyone needs intercession.

But let's look at five reasons why leaders in all seven mountains need intercession more than others.

(1) Leaders have more responsibility and accountability.

Q: Does God have a double standard of judgment?

My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment.

James 3:1

(2) Leaders experience more temptation.

The higher you go in leadership and influence, the higher you go on Satan's hit list.

God is no respecter of persons, but Satan is!

(3) Because of this, leaders are more targets of spiritual warfare.

(4) Leaders have more influence on others.

Satan gets a bigger bang for his buck!

(5) Leaders have more visibility.

Subject to:

- Gossip
- Criticism

People want to tear you down to reduce you to their size.

Therefore:

Leaders need special quantity and quality of intercession.

3. The Prayer Life of Christian Leaders

Joshua? Fighting but not praying much.
Same with Christian leaders.

Survey of 572 D.Min. pastors:

Average: 22 min per day

1 out of 4: less than 10 min per day

All agree that this is not enough!

What to do about it?

- 1. Pray more
- 2. Receive intercession

4. Receiving Intercession is Biblical

- 1. Joshua fighting Amalek (Exodus 17)

 Joshua would not have won without Moses' intercession.
- 2. A quote from Paul:

Now I beg you, brethren, through the Lord Jesus Christ, and through the love of the Spirit that you strive together with me in your prayers to God for me,

Romans 15:30

We have the names of personal intercessors for Apostles Paul and Peter.

Paul:

I implore Euodia and I implore Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. And I urge you also, true companion, help these women who labored with me in the gospel,

Philippians 4:2-3

Peter: Herod killed James but not Peter.

Peter, therefore, was kept in prison but prayer for him was made to God without ceasing by the church.

Acts 12:5

Where was "The Church?"

So, when he had considered this, he came to the house of Mary, the mother of John whose surname was Mark, where many were gathered together praying.

Acts 12:12

5. Intercession for Leaders is Underutilized

Why?

(1)Ignorance

(2) Rugged Individualism

"If I'm going to make it with God, I'm going to do it myself!"

Reflects:

- 1. A low view of the body of Christ.
- 2. Pride

(3) Fear

With personal intercessors comes a deeper level of:

- Vulnerability
- Accountability


(4) Spiritual Arrogance

(5) False Humility

Who am I to receive intercessors?

Answer: This is the way God has designed his kingdom!

I-3: Remote



Bill Bright

Doris and I have 41 I-3s.

Note: Intercessors must pray for spouses of leaders!

I-2: Regular

Doris and I have 20.

I-1: Close

Doris and I have 1: Chuck Pierce



We have a personal relationship with all 21.

18 have the gift of intercession.

Communication is very important.

Also Holy Spirit gives them information.

New I-2s:

"The moment you accept this responsibility, we give God permission to tell you everything and anything about us!"

Example . . .


The most important group of people next to immediate family.


7. Intercession for Christian Leaders in the Workplace

The Spirit is speaking about reformation of our society.


The Seven Mountains

Ephesians 6 – Paul's strongest chapter on spiritual warfare.

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age. Ephesians 6:12

How do we battle principalities and powers?

1. Personally

Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. Ephesians 6:11

2. Corporately through intercessors.

Pray for all the saints

Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints.

Ephesians 6:18

Pray for Paul as leader

And for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel.

Ephesians 6:19

Pray for Paul's ministry

For which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly as I ought to speak.

Ephesians 6:20

How does Paul service his intercessors?

By sending a personal messenger

But that you also may know my affairs and how I am doing, Tychicus, a beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord, will make all things known to you.

Ephesians 6:21

Two messages

Whom I have sent to you for this very purpose, that you may know our affairs, and that he may comfort your hearts.

Ephesians 6:22
